1. Breakout Session Reports

Contractors

There was conversations as follows:

- The Prompt Payment legislation was discussed. There is controversy around subcontractor definitions so they need to do more digging.
- There was a call for input from clients in the new revision

Manufacturers

There were conversations around:

- The same issues as others with transportation, supply chain and labour shortages
- With labor they are seeing a shift in work/life balance forcing costs up
- They hope to create better communications going forward with suppliers and contractors

Suppliers

There were conversations such as:

- Recapping December meeting discussions around what value they can add to contractors and industry
- CLR update re removal of manhour collections to TIAA
- QRQC Program (i.e. NIA) what could that look like in Alberta? Would it be in conjunction with Ontario? TIAC has been putting that together
- Denis Formula what previously worked and/or what needs to be changed
- Golf tournaments and adding a charity aspect to them, alternating cities and investigating other groups success with those ideas
- Sponsorships mostly comes from them and manufacturers, so they discussed strategies on how to broaden that reach
- Career Fairs pre-Covid there were 3 in Calgary, 2 in Edmonton that they felt was very beneficial, so hopefully they can participate again as they become available
- Lastly, how can they better promote contractor/manufacturer committee meetings to potential members, which could show value to bringing them back to TIAA?

6. Committee Reports

Apprenticeship | SAIT & NAIT |

SAIT

- Thanked TIAA for their ongoing support
- There is no longer a government exam which was a previous road block for those with English as a second language; they have alternate ways to test people adequately
- Reminder of the TIAA scholarships and other funding available online
- 2021-2022 year was back and forth offering virtual and in class options
- 2022-2023 only offering one intake for each period of training. Current enrollments (all time lows) as of May 26 were as follows:
- ∘ October 31 4 out of 20 seats available
- January 3, 2023 10 of 20 seats are still available
- February 27 18 of 20 are available

NAIT

- Classes will continue in blended format for 2022-2023 intake
- Next class is August 29 for 1st years; 9 registered to date
- Asbestos removal courses continue to be offered through Continuing Education or Corporate & International Training

ATCC

TIAC

THERMAL INSULATION ASSOCIATION OF ALBERTA

The TIAC Conference was held in Ottawa August 17 - 20, 2022 at the Marriott Hotel with approximately 140 attending, including spouses and partners. There was a good mix of contractors, manufacturers and distributors.

All presentations were received positively:

- Management paradox navigating the workforce with our 4 generations that are working at this time
- A review of the North American Commercial and Industrial Insulation Standards Manual which was a deep dive into the 10th edition which had questions and answers given by Rob English of Owens Corning
- Update on the Denis Formula and its method of measurement. This was given by Tom McVicar of the Thomas Group which was developed by our TIAA group of volunteers.
- AIQ's Insulation Inspector Training Program from Pat Boulanger as he shared insight to this great program.
- Breakout sessions for our 3 divisions
 - a. Contractors section started ran 12:50 pm to 3:10pm with lots of discussions around cold application in commercial buildings along with manpower and material issues all across the provinces. Outside of Alberta, it is expecting lots of new construction work for both industrial and commercial projects. Alberta expects to have lots still in maintenance work for this year and 2023. New construction projects should pickup for Alberta starting in the middle of 2023. It was all agreed that we need to keep close communication with distributors and manufacturers moving forward to get our projects finished on time and on budget.

A motion was sent to the TIAC Board to pursue funding from TIAC to acquire legal counsel to see if it is possible to change the Denis Formula to the TIAC Industrial Insulation Method of Measurement.

b. Manufacturers and Distributors sectional meetings were also well attended and of course material delivers, freight and upcoming projects were discussed along with shortage of manpower and working from home. With the ever changing of companies being taken over or joined as one, the due structure for belonging to TIAC had to be reviewed. No decision on this was completed but reviewed with the TIAC Board on Saturday.

Thursday night was a gathering by all for a dinner cruise on the Ottawa river. It was a great place to meet and mingle with everyone.

Friday had 2 other great sessions along with the CAN/AM meeting.

Saturday morning was our Annual General Meeting followed by 2 more speakers. Jennifer Botterill, a three-time Olympic gold medalist and an announcer on SportsNet, gave us very interesting options moving forward.

Of course, I gave my question to her on when she will recognize that Connor is away better hockey player than Auston.

The afternoon was our incoming Board meeting followed by the President's dinner and dance.

Overall, it was a great conference and wished we had more Albertans there.

NAIT REPORT

NAIT's Insulator Program is continuing to champion student success that is relevant and responsive to the needs of industry.

NAIT has decided to continue running hybrid courses in the fall allowing students the flexibility to learn from home while still gaining the hand skills and training in a shop setting.

Our classes will remain single classes throughout the year, but we are maintaining open slots to allow for more classes if we get a waiting list. We ran a double class a 1st and a 3rd in March with great success and would like to see more of them in the future if numbers pick up.

Apprenticeship numbers were down for 22/23 with NAIT running 6 classes with an average of 17 students per class. We finished up our last classes of the year on April 21st sending 44 students back into the field to impress you with their talents and skills. The next class is August 28th, and it will be a 1st year class to jump start the season followed by a 3rd, 2nd, 3rd, and a 2nd. Our instructors are working on Note Package material, lesson plans for virtual class along with Harmonization material which we hope the PAC start up soon along with Provincial Harmonization of our trade.

NAIT attended Skill's along with a few of their keen apprentices allowing them to showcase their talent and answer any questions that may have arisen along the way along with helping in the try a trade that was happening at the time. I believe our students rocked the place taking first, second and third positions!

The NAIT Insulator Program is still open for business for visits from Industry as well as Asbestos Removal courses continue to be offered at NAIT either through Continuing Education or Corporate and International Training. If you have any questions regarding Asbestos Removal courses or our Apprenticeship Program, we would be happy to answer them!

NAIT Insulator program staff are always looking for opportunities to visit Industry and to tour facilities to see what new technology and advanced practices you are incorporating into your projects. We are always on the lookout for pictures of workmanship and projects to showcase to our students and to incorporate into our curriculum. The NAIT Insulator Program has an open-door policy for visitors that would like to view our shop and projects and the coffee is always on!

SAIT TRAINING REPORT

Greetings,

At SAIT, our primary goal is to equip our students with the necessary tools, training, and abilities to thrive in today's ever-evolving job market. We firmly believe in preparing our students for prosperous careers and fulfilling lives. This vision is achievable thanks to the invaluable contributions and support from partners like the Thermal Insulation Association of Alberta (TIAA). Through your unwavering commitment to SAIT's School of Construction and the Insulator (Heat and Frost) apprenticeship program, we offer an exceptional educational journey to our students. Your support ensures our graduates enter the workforce with the essential skills they need to flourish.

2022-23 Academic Year

We celebrated a full class of graduates in January 2023. This class celebrated the outstanding achievements of one of our exceptional students, Samantha Fonos. We were thrilled to announce that Samantha has been bestowed with the esteemed Dean's Award for the Winter intake. The Dean's Award is a testament to Samantha's remarkable performance in not just academics and attendance but also her exemplary attitude and leadership qualities. This prestigious recognition is based on five key attributes: honesty and integrity, the ability to inspire others, unwavering commitment and passion, effective communication skills, and a commendable sense of humility. We extend our heartfelt congratulations to Samantha on this well-deserved honour.

In October 2022, SAIT hosted 150 Grades 8 and 9 students for the Jill of All Trades event. This special occasion provided them with immersive, hands-on experiences to explore various careers in the skilled trades field. From mastering bricklaying and glass cutting to confidently handling wrenches and bending sheet metal, these talented students saw a promising future in Alberta's skilled trades industry.

At SAIT, we have noticed a concerning trend regarding the fill rate of our insulator apprenticeship program. While the 3rd period has achieved a commendable 100% fill rate, the 1st and 2nd periods have only reached a 30% fill rate. This discrepancy raises sustainability concerns for the apprenticeship program. It is crucial for the industry to recognize the positive impact they can have on the health of apprenticeships by actively enrolling and sending apprentices. This concern is not limited to SAIT alone, but extends provincially and nationally. Various initiatives have been introduced to address this issue and support the decline in skilled trade workers. For instance, the Canada-Alberta Job Grant and Careerlauncher programs offer opportunities for employers to receive government contributions covering two-thirds of the associated costs. These initiatives aim to encourage and assist employers in attracting more individuals to pursue careers in skilled trades. We encourage you to explore these programs further and consider the benefits they offer in mitigating the declining workforce in the skilled trades industry.



LEADERSHIP THROUGH ENERGY CONSERVATION

Member Insulator Scholarships

The Thermal Insulation Association of Alberta has a member scholarship program in place designed to recognize and support those first, second and third year apprenticeship students employed by current TIAA member companies. In recognition of the hard work undertaken by the students in the NAIT and SAIT Thermal Insulator Apprenticeship Program and in order to help them achieve their maximum potential without being hindered by financial hardships, TIAA offers a number of scholarships every year, ranging from \$1,200 to \$2,000.

DEADLINE & ELIGIBILTY

Scholarship applications are accepted for review by the scholarship committee based on submissions received by March 31, July 31 and November 30 and applications must be submitted within 6 months of students finishing their last course.

Some of the other eligibility criteria is as follows and is subject to change at any time.

Applicants must:

- Be a Canadian and an Alberta resident.
- Be a registered Alberta apprentice in the Insulator trade who is or was employed by a contractor member of TIAA during, or just prior to their apprenticeship training period.
- Have completed their first, second or third year period of technical training, and be registered in the next period of technical training.
- Demonstrate their financial need.
- Submit a 100-word summary along with any other requirements on the application form.
- Have their employer complete the Employer Recommendation and Certification as outlined in the application.
- Submit a NAIT/SAIT transcript of marks or copy of government confirmation letter of marks that is sent to all apprentices upon completing a technical training term.

SELECTION PROCESS

Applicants will be selected on a combined evaluation of the eligibility criteria and information required and submitted in the application. Class attendance and attitude may also be included in this evaluation.


